

# CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

University of Idaho offers bachelor's degrees in Coeur d'Alene in partnership with North Idaho College. Lower division courses are offered through NIC, and upper division courses are through U of I Coeur d'Alene.

It is possible to take classes from both NIC and U of I at the same time. This might happen when you're nearly done with an associate's degree and would like to get a head start before fully transferring to U of I.

## HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

### • ADMISSIONS

- If you plan to take both NIC and U of I courses, you'll need to apply with both institutions.

### • FINANCIAL AID

- Submit your FAFSA by Dec. 1 at [fafsa.ed.gov](http://fafsa.ed.gov) to be considered for the maximum amount of financial aid for the next academic year.
  - U of I FAFSA school code: 001626
  - NIC FAFSA school code: 001623
- You can only receive financial aid through one institution per semester. Students must receive financial aid from the institution where they are ultimately degree-seeking. If a student is degree-seeking at both NIC (associate's) and U of I (bachelor's), their aid should come from the U of I.

### • REGISTRATION AT NIC AND U OF I

- Your first semester at NIC you must meet with an NIC advisor before registering for classes. As a U of I student, you must meet with your advisor every semester.

- Summer/Fall registration opens in March/April, spring registration in October/November. **Plan enough time to have your transcripts already evaluated for the best pick of classes.**
- Each semester you are concurrently enrolled, submit [this form](#) to [cardinalcentral@nic.edu](mailto:cardinalcentral@nic.edu).

### • PAYING YOUR FEES

- Concurrently enrolled students must remit fees to NIC and U of I separately.
- If you need to defer fees at NIC before the start of a term, submit a copy of your accepted and signed U of I award letter from VandalWeb to the NIC Student Accounts Office. Your financial aid must be sufficient to cover your NIC costs. If your U of I financial aid is insufficient to pay your NIC tuition, you are responsible for paying the difference in accordance with NIC's published dates.

### • AT THE END OF THE SEMESTER

- Make sure you order an official NIC transcript and have it sent to the U of I Registrar's office. The transcript request form can be found at [nic.edu/registrar](http://nic.edu/registrar).

# **CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT**

REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS CONCURRENTLY ENROLLED AT NIC AND U OF I	
TYPE OF AID	CREDIT REQUIREMENT
<b>GRANTS AND LOANS</b>	Student must enroll in at least: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>6 credits for part-time aid</li> <li>12 credits for full-time aid</li> </ul> At least 1 credit must be from U of I.
<b>WORK STUDY AT U OF I</b>	Student must enroll in at least 12 credits/semester. At least 1 credit must be from U of I.
<b>DISCOVER IDAHO!</b> <b>SCHOLARSHIPS</b> <small>(for non-Idaho, non-WUE-state residents)</small>	Student must enroll in at least 12 credits/semester.  At least 6 of the credits must be from U of I.
<b>GO IDAHO!</b> <b>SCHOLARSHIPS</b> <small>(for Idaho residents)</small>	
<b>WESTERN UNDERGRADUATE EXCHANGE</b> <small>(for transfer students from AK, AZ, CA, CO, Guam, HI, MT, NV, NM, ND, OR, SD, UT, WA, WY, CNMI)</small>	Student must enroll in at least 12 credits/semester from U of I.

\*Note that remedial (0-level) classes do not count toward your financial aid total.
