APPROVED ACTIVITIES WORTH

2 POINTS

- Successful Completion of a U of I course that carries an "International" Gen Ed designation.
- Successful completion of a U of I course that has a significant international component based on the course syllabus but without "International" Gen Ed designation.
- Paid and unpaid work experience on campus such as SGS language tutors, work study students in IPO, etc.
- · Participation in an on-campus leadership activity that has a significant international component (ex: organizing India Night or Cruise the World, serve as a board member of an international student club, being a conversation partner for a non-English speaking student, etc., but not just attending an event such as Cruise the World, etc.).
- · Participation in a summer internship, lab or archival research in the United States (can be with faculty) requiring active use of a world language (at least 2 days).
- Work as a SGS language tutor.

3 POINTS

- Use of non-English language at an academic conference at the U of I, in the region or in the United States, i.e., a poster presentation at the annual Office of Undergraduate Research Symposium.

- Successful completion of U of I faculty-led summer session course outside of the United States OR a U of I faculty-led semester course that includes a semester break excursion outside of the United States.
- · Successful completion of a study abroad course (USAC, Harlaxton, etc.) for the duration of a summer session (at least 10 days).
- Participation in summer research project outside of the U.S (at least 10 days).
- Successful completion of a summer language study at another U.S college or University (at least one

5 POINTS

- Participate in a semester-long internship requiring active use of a world language, including semester-long internship with ALCP and intensive English program for international students (ex: FLEN 498).
- Successful completion of a semester-long study abroad program where another language is spoken.
- Successful completion of a U of I faculty-led semester-long course outside of the U.S.
- · Receive an international Distinguished Scholarship Program award/scholarship, such as a Fulbright, or DAAD RISE (see list).
- Successful completion of a Minor in a world language, a minor in Asian Studies, or International Studies at the University of Idaho. **6 POINTS**
- Successful completion of a year-long study abroad program where another language is spoken.
- Successful completion of a Major in a world language at the University of Idaho.
